Resolutions – Any DRCI Shareholder wishing to submit a Resolution must also do so in writing or by email by May 21, 2014 by noon.



The opportunity to vote is something very important. Shareholders, the time is just around the corner for our Annual Meeting once again. The meeting packets will be distributed in the near future with all the information required. Within that packet is your ballot connected to any items that need to be voted upon. Whether you vote and mail your ballot back, or attend the Annual Meeting and hand deliver it, your actions are wished for, appreciated and needed. We need to have about 200 ballots

to conduct business and that is actually not an easy task to accomplish. In fact, since some of the Resolutions require a 2/3 majority vote, 265 votes to pass, this obviously would require more ballots than 265 to be returned to have those Resolutions approved. To go through all the effort to create the packet, and have the meeting is very time consuming and costly. Please make all the effort worthwhile and VOTE!

Consent Resolutions Forthcoming to All Shareholders: At the Annual Shareholders meeting in 2013 you were requested to vote on two Resolutions that required a 2/3 majority vote for approval. In terms of number of votes a 2/3 majority requires 265 votes in favor of the Resolution to pass.

What happened with the voting in 2013 is an excellent example of what can happen when there is voter apathy (Shareholders not exercising their right/duty to vote) on an issue that requires a 2/3 majority to pass.



A majority of your Board has decided to ask you to vote one more time on these Resolutions because of the vast majority of those voting last year being in favor of both Resolutions.

Thank you very much for your consideration and vote.


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Resolution #1 was seeking a change in Section 2.7 of the Declaration to clarify the language and specifically requires a 2/3 vote of the Shareholders to approve any lot sales. That Resolution was not approved as it didn't get 265 votes in favor, but it did receive 177 votes (81%) for, 31 against and 8 abstentions for a total of 216 votes.

Resolution #2 was seeking approval to sell two lots. The first lot is two lots being sold as one off of the North Camp Road on the Little Dead and the second lot is located on Stickney Drive on the West end of the Basin. That lot is the former West end access site, (See above Lots for Sale Table). This Resolution also needs a 2/3 vote for approval and again it didn't pass, but achieved 168 votes (78%) in favor, 43 votes against and 5 abstentions for a total of 216 votes.

The Board has decided to add two additional lots for sale as part of Resolution #2. These are Lots 9 and 10 of Assessor's Plat 26 of the Dead River Basin. These lots are located in Champion Township at the West end of the Basin near the CR AAO Bridge off of the Red Road. These are platted lots and as such should be sold to be consistent with what has been done in the past with all of the other platted lots. No sale price has been established yet for these lots.

Additionally we are adding a new Resolution #3 which deals with revisions needed to Declaration Section 2, being Sections 2.2, 2.3 and 2.4. These revisions will correct the language which currently requires all improvements on the Basin to be assessed back to all of the Lot Owners. By making this change the Board in the future could do projects around the Basin and not have to charge the Shareholders as required in these sections of the Declaration. The Board recommends a vote in favor of all three Shareholder Consent Resolu-

This is a day for DRCI Shareholders and their neighbors to celebrate our fishery with our children and grandchildren. It is our goal to promote the sport of fishing with our next generation of stewards of the Basin.

Forestry Management Thoughts: In the last Newsletter article “Forestry Notes from the Board” it was discussed that at this time there is no planned cutting for 2014. Our main objective for now would be further cataloging of our forest holdings, both under the Commercial Forest Act and also with the help of a professional forest management consultant.

At the last meeting of the DRCI Board on April 30, 2014 a decision was made to request a formal proposal for services from a professional forestry consulting firm to provide DRCI with forest management consulting and planning services. The staff of Green Timber Consulting Foresters, Inc., is in the process of putting together this proposal.

Based on the decision to move ahead with a proposal from Green Timber, the Board discussed and decided that at this time it would delay moving forward with the selection of a Forestry Committee.



This decision was based on the information provided by Green Timber in response to what they thought to be the most efficient way to work with DRCI and provide their professional services.

The Forestry Committee was a valuable resource for DRCI over the years and especially in the early years of DRCI when logging was a big income source for DRCI. Many thanks to those who served on that Committee for several years.

A large portion of DRCI’s timber resource has been logged and now the Board has determined that it is time to move forward with a new plan and come up with a long-term management approach to look to further enhance our current management plan and to include our non-Commercial Forest Act properties and our non-forested areas.

REPORT OF INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the Board of Directors

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Dead River Campers, Inc., (a Michigan Company) which comprise the balance sheet as of December 31, 2012, and the related statements of income, stockholders' equity and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting principles used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Campers Ask Extension Of 'Basin' Road

ISHPEMING, Sept. 11 — The Dead River Sports and Camping association today made public a petition it has forwarded to the Marquette county road commission, requesting the commission to extend County Road GU and JI to provide better travel facilities to persons living and having camps in the Dead River Basin area.

The resolution already has received the support of the Ishpeming Chamber of Commerce and Junior Chamber of Commerce, as well as the Negaunee Business and Professional association and other civic groups in Ishpeming and Negaunee.

The petition follows: Want Easier Access

"A considerable amount of money has been invested by people in Negaunee and Ishpeming townships and because of the following reasons are causing this petition to be served on the Marquette County Road commission:

"Whereas, we can drive into these cottages only a few months in late summer and fall, because of lack of good roads and poor condition of existing brush roads, and

"Whereas, forest fire danger is very high in this territory, because of the nature of the type of forest, which is mainly jack-pine and poplar, and

"Whereas, heavy snow conditions in this region make it necessary to remove snow from the roofs of cottages at least two or three times during the winter months, and

"Whereas, the construction of this road would create a first class fire lane in case of forest fires, and would create a tie-in route between the county road north of Ishpeming and Negaunee for use by the conservation department in patrol work and fire fighting, and

Chance For Power Line

"Whereas, introduction of a power line to this area depends largely upon the number of customers, and this affected area contains approximately 35 potential customers if year around use of the cottages is obtained, and

"Whereas, the Michigan department of conservation makes annual plants of trout in the Hoist Basin, and

"Whereas, we are desirous of making available to the people of Marquette county the benefit of fishing in our huge reservoir of water, obtaining one or more public fishing sites on these waters, and

"Whereas, we are desirous of making accessible the scenic region of this territory,

"Therefore, the dead River Sports and Camping association and its members, who are taxpayers in Ishpeming and Negaunee townships, are petitioning the Marquette county road commission for extension and construction of county roads GU and JI to join with county road JH in section 16, T. 48 N. — Range 26W.

"The approximate location of the road is hereby listed:

"County road GU is graded to a spot near the township lines of Negaunee and Ishpeming, or to the west line of Section 1, T. 48, R. 27W. The proposed route of the road will be east and south of the west line of Section 1 and then into Section 12, T. 48, R. 27 and 16, T. 48, R. 26, and to be joined with County Road JH which in turn joins County Road 510. This road will be built probably at an average distance of five or six hundred feet from the shoreline of the basin.

Public Fishing Site

"We hope this information will cover the project sufficiently.

and we want to thank you for giving us your assistance in attempting to realize an early completion of this road. A public fishing site will be our goal for the south side of the basin and along the route of the proposed road.

"This project meets with the high approval of the Michigan department of conservation.

"In addition to this a power-line project is being considered for this area which will probably amount to \$30,000 — \$40,000. Such improvements should be highly recommended for the betterment of our county resources. One hundred and twenty customers are necessary for the above consideration, which makes it necessary to obtain the potential 35 customers in the area which would be served by this road.

"We, the undersigned members of the Dead River Sports and Camping association, as property-owners and tax payers in the townships of Ishpeming and Negaunee, are herewith petitioning the Marquette County Road commission for construction and continuance of County Road GU in an easterly direction through Section 1, T. 48, R. 27, Section 12, 7, 17, and 16 in T. 48, R. 26; thereby joining county roads GU and JH. This road is to be constructed a reasonable distance away from the basin to insure privacy of cottage-owners wherever it is possible."

CR GU is the South Camp Road

CR JH is the Hoist Road off of CR 510

CR JI is Abandoned? It is not on the current Road Commission Certified County Road Maps as of 2014. We have asked the Road Commission to confirm when/if this road was abandoned. This was to be a connector from CR GU to CR JH and then to CR 510.

FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMITTEE:



Fish & Wildlife Committee Report – Earl Hawn Chairman, DRCI Fish and Wildlife Committee

There are changes in the fee structure and coverage of fishing licenses in Michigan for this year with five different fishing licenses, plus two hunt/fish combo licenses available:

- **Fish 24-hour - \$10 (good for MI residents and non-residents for all species)**
- **Fish 72-hour - \$30 (good for MI residents and non-residents for all species)**
- **Fish all-species nonresident annual - \$76**
- **Fish all-species MI resident annual - \$26**
- **Fish all-species senior annual - \$11 (good for MI residents only)**
- **Hunt/fish combo nonresident - \$266**
- **Hunt/fish combo MI resident - \$76**

This past winter we received a DEQ permit to look at performing some work at the pond located next to the dam. The permit allows for us to “Regrade approximately a 15-foot wide by 275-foot long area on both sides of the existing pond for access. Place approximately 67-yards of rock rip-rap at the outlet of the pond for bank stabilization and better access. Redistribute some wood debris that has washed into the pond around the pond. All work shall be completed in accordance with attached plans and conditions dated March 19, 2014.”

The permit will allow for us to improve this site for better family shoreline fishing access as well as room for hands-on instructional space during the annual Kid’s Fish Derby. The scope of the work is not extensive and we will be seeking volunteers to help perform some of the work should we elect to move forward with the project. We will be leaving all of the woody debris intact.

Fathead Minnow



Scientific Name: *Pimephales promelas*
Common Name: Rosey-reds (color variation)
Color: Olive-gray.

Markings: White on belly, diffuse dark blotch on dorsal fin, head is almost black on males during breeding.

Length: 2-3 inches

Susceptible to VHS: No

We will also be stocking about 300,000 fat-head minnows again this spring after the ice is out. In a recent article I read it noted: “Mature fathead adults seldom exceed three inches in length and usually live for only 12 to 15 months. Mature males are usually larger than the females and can be distinguished from the females during the breeding season by a series of breeding tubercles on the nose or forehead. Older males are often darker than the females. The males may also possess a hard pad on the top of their head, used in the preparation of the nest or spawning site. The males are also responsible for guarding the nest. Mature females may spawn weekly, depositing 200 to 500 eggs per spawn. Some females may lay up to 4,000 eggs per season.”

Fatheads “prefer to deposit their eggs on the underneath surface of rocks, plants or logs. They prefer to spawn upside down!”

The nesting needs of this and other forage fish is one of the reasons we are encouraging and attempting to educate our residents about the importance of leaving woody debris on the shoreline.

As you are aware, we have a shortage of forage fish in our Basin so we have been attacking this issue from various angles. Stocking may be an important part of the answer; however, ultimately, spawning opportunities for our minnows is the least expensive and longer-lasting answer.

We have agreed to continue to conduct an annual minnow survey on the Basin in order to have data to track our progress. The survey period is for one week and we continue to seek volunteers who would be willing to assist us in the survey. We will provide you with a net issued by the DNR and the necessary tools to conduct the survey. It doesn’t take a whole bunch of your time and can be quite educational for the entire family! Please contact the office at 485-1975 to volunteer. We need 12 volunteers.

We are anticipating the stocking of about 26,000 walleye fingerlings depending on availability this coming year. The DNR management plan for the Ba-


sin calls for stocking of walleye every other year for the next few years, again depending on availability. We feel fairly confident that this will happen.

We have been cautioned by the DNR that we may very well see a noticeable increase in the number of Northern Pike over the next couple of years. If you recall, our minnow study last year showed a significant increase in the number of minnow sized pike we found in our survey nets versus the year prior.

We would like to remind our friends that the black bear are coming out of hibernation and will be seeking our bird feeders, etc. Pay close attention to what is going on around you and have a safe and enjoyable spring.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

The DRCI Finance Committee met at the Marquette Wells Fargo offices in February 2014.

We reviewed the investment portfolio results for the 4th quarter 2013 and the overall annualized results for all of 2013. We placed special focus of our review



on our fixed income segment of our portfolio, 45.5% of the portfolio's overall value. With several corporate bonds reaching maturity, we reviewed options for reinvestment of those funds. The portfolio increased its book value by 6.12% or \$86,700 for the year ending Dec 2013. This overall appreciation was in line with overall market conditions and our risk tolerance for the portfolio. This was a good year for our investments for DRCI!

Our discussions progressed to review the tax implications of our portfolio's growth and overall tax liabilities incurred by DRCI as a whole. We confirmed that there is room for improved communications/coordination of individual asset buy/sell decisions within the portfolio especially in the 4th quarter of the year. Action items were developed and agreed to

by the Committee. We had an opportunity to review the most recent external audit findings of the DRCI overall financial controls. We were encouraged by the thoroughness of the audit and financial controls were found to be order.


There was a detailed line by line review of the proposed 2014 DRCI Operating Budget. We all continue to be disappointed how much we need to spend on legal fees defending the DRCI and its Shareholders.

We do recommend that the DRCI Board attempt to get more aggressive on the sale of our excess lots and turn those assets into working capital. While the DRCI excess lots are in fact listed in line with recent market value assessments, we do recommend the Board consider additional alternatives to a more proactive sales approach.

We concluded the meeting with reviewing the DRCI Board's objectives and priorities for 2014 and discussing how the DRCI Finance Committee might be able add more support to the achievement of those objectives.

REMINDERS

Water Surface Elevation. If you are interested in the water surface elevation, log onto <http://www.wisconsinpublicservice.com/news/hydro/hydrodata.asp> or get to this same website via the DRCI website link for current information. We thank UPPCO for making this information available to us.

Tree Removal Issues. If you have trees to remove please fill out a cutting permit and send it in to DRCI or contact Bruce Bussone at 362-2325. In an effort to maintain some control on time limits, the Board has put a limit of 1 year from date of issue for tree cutting permits. Each Shareholder is responsible for any trees cut by contractors you have hired. You are reminded that tree cutting on common /CFR lands is prohibited.

Road Improvements. Shareholders are reminded to get permits from the Board for road improvements. This would include any changes to current roads as well as tree removals to widen access. Each Shareholder is responsible for roadwork done by any contractor you have hired. Be mindful that changes to a road easement, or adding a new road easement within a plat, must be done in compliance with the Michigan Land Division Act provisions for plat changes and DRCI Rules. See the web page for more information. This also applies to utility easements within a plat.

Bridges. DRCI committed to maintain two bridges in our original documents; they are located on North Basin Drive and Three Mile Road. Please report any bridge damage you observe to the Board immediately.

Stock Certificates. You are reminded to update your stock certificate ownership and addresses when something changes that

would change those certificates. This would include a death, divorce, move, etc. There is no charge to change the certificate and it can be done easily by sending the certificate to DRCI with a copy of the Recorded Deed for the change listing all the owners. Please let new camp owners know that they should submit a copy of their recorded deed and obtain a stock certificate upon purchase of their camp. Additionally, the corporate by-laws, Declaration, rules and regulations can be found at our webpage at www.deadrivercampersinc.com

Utility Easements: Please keep all utility easements such as overhead power-line areas clear of boats, trailers and other items so that UPPCO has clear access to the easement areas at all times. This is especially important during the Winter months when they may have to get in an easement area to repair power lines or transformers.

Zoning Violations. Shareholders should report perceived zoning violations to their respective townships. These violations would include multiple camps on single lots and excessive blight or junk. The townships can be contacted at; Ishpeming Township-485-5411, Negaunee Township-475-7869 and Champion Township-339-2920.

Renting of Shareholder Single Family Residences. DRCI Declaration Section 4.1 reads "Lots shall be used solely for the construction of one single-family residence and struc-

tures and outbuildings incidental to the use of it (including, without limitations, barns, stables and garages for private, and not public or commercial, use) and shall be limited in use to single-family residential purposes and incidental uses." This declaration prohibits the rental of any Shareholder single family residences on the Basin.

Use of Shoreline. As most shoreline is privately owned, when someone is in the need of bathroom facilities while out on the water please respect that you may be using one of our Shareholder's beachfronts to do so.

Submerged Hazards. When water levels are low please take extra caution to avoid submerged hazards while boating. We should all try to mark hazards as they are found, but safety is still up to the operator.

Reward The Board continues to offer a \$1,000 reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of any illegal activity on camper's property.

Maps: (Updated June, 2012) Maps of the Basin ownership by DRCI and each lot by Shareholder are now available. Each map includes Champion, Ishpeming and Negaunee Townships on a page and an index of Shareholders by plat and lot number or by parcel number for non-platted lots. Maps are 24 x 36 inches printed on quality paper in color. Order forms are available on the DRCI web page under Documents. Cost is \$35.
